'The Program' means the program on the diskettes supplied in this package.

1. Copyright

Material within the Program is copyright Locomotive. Locomotive grants to the purchaser of this package a non-exclusive right to use The Program in accordance with these terms and conditions. Such Licence may be transferred only in accordance with Clause 3 below. Any other use or dealing not expressly authorised by these terms and conditions is strictly prohibited.

2. Use

The Program may only be used on a single machine or terminal at any one time but may be copied or merged into other programs in support of that use. Any such copying or merger is subject to there being no modification of The Program and in particular to the copyright notice of Locomotive being preserved in the copied or combined program. Save for copying or merger within other programs as aforesaid, any other operations (including modification or translation from machine readable form) are expressly prohibited.

3. Transfer

The Program may be transferred to a third party provided the original Program and all copies are transferred or otherwise destroyed and provided further these terms and conditions are produced to that third party and prior to the transfer that party agrees and undertakes to observe and continue to observe the same. Without such transfer and undertaking any application of The Program or copies thereof by any other person will not be authorised by Locomotive and will be in breach of Locomotive's copyright and other proprietary rights.

4. Documentation

The documentation accompanying The Program is also copyright Locomotive. However, no right to reproduce that documentation in part or in whole is granted by Locomotive. Should additional copies of the documentation be required for whatever reason, application must be made in writing to Locomotive which will be considered in its discretion.

5. Breach

If the user for the time being acts in breach of any of these terms and conditions it shall indemnify Locomotive against all losses suffered (including loss of profits) and the licence granted hereunder shall be deemed to be terminated forthwith. On termination the user shall deliver up to Locomotive all infringing and lawful copies of The Program.

6. Exclusions

Neither Locomotive nor any person authorised by it gives warranties or makes representations that the program is error free or will meet functions required by the user. It shall be the responsibility of the user to satisfy itself that The Program meets the user's requirements. 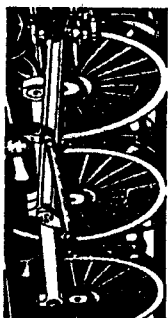

PCW8256/8512 Keyboards Disc

The master disc supplied in this pack contains:

- A range of Keyboard Files which allow you to configure LocoScript 2 to use any of the different nationality keyboard layouts available on the Amstrad PCW with any nationality of LocoScript 2.
- A special program called LocoKey which enables you to tailor any keyboard layout to your particular requirements by allowing you to specify which character is typed when you press each of the possible key combinations in LocoScript 2.

If you want to use, for example, a French version of LocoScript on your English QWERTY keyboard, then the instructions you need to follow are given in the 'Keyboards Disc' booklet supplied in this pack. (Ignore the note on page 1 about upgrading to LocoScript version 2.12 or later: this is automatically taken care of by the programs on your disc.)

If you want to modify any of the standard keyboard layouts, then you need to follow the instructions in the separate LocoKey booklet. However, don't follow the instructions given on page 7-8 of this booklet for setting up a LocoKey disc: instead, use the steps given overleaf.

Note: Both booklets were originally supplied with slightly different products. You should therefore ignore the details they give about the range of files on the disc: the correct details are given in the READ.ME document on Side 1 of the disc.

- Before you use either of these products, you first need to create a new Start-of-day disc by running the Installation program on Side 2 of the disc. How to run the Installation program is described in the 'Update Information' booklet supplied in this pack.

Setting up a LocoKey disc

The following steps set up a working disc to use when you want to use the LocoKey program.

Note: You will need a new blank disc to use as your LocoKey disc.

- 1 Load LocoScript 2.
- 2 Use the Copy disc option in the F2 Disc menu to make a copy of Side 1 of the Keyboards master disc (a 180k disc) on a new blank disc. Remember to make sure that the Keyboards master disc is write-protected (ie. the two small write-protect holes are both open) before you start to copy it.

The steps are as follows: With the Disc Manager Screen displayed, press [C] to display the Disc menu, check that Copy disc is highlighted and press [ENTER]. LocoScript then displays a message on the screen asking you to confirm that you want to copy a disc, check that the option to copy a 180k disc is selected and press [ENTER]. From then on, follow the instructions on the screen - inserting the Keyboards master disc and pressing [ENTER] when asked for the Source disc, and inserting your new disc and pressing [ENTER] when asked for the Destination disc. When copying is finished, select the option to Return to disc manager and press [ENTER]; do not try to copy Side 2 of the disc.

- 3 Use the Move file option in the F3 File menu to move the Keyboard file(s) that you will want to use LocoKey to modify, from group 1 on Drive A to group 0.

To move a file, first move the File cursor over the name of the file you want to move. Then press [M] to display the File menu, move the Menu cursor to Move file and press [ENTER]. A message then appears, asking you to pick out the group to which you want to move the file: move the File cursor to group 0 on Drive A and press [ENTER]. When the menu appears giving details of the file you are moving, check that this shows the correct details and then press [ENTER].

- You have now created a disc to use as your LocoKey disc. Note, however, that this disc contains a couple of files that aren't required for using LocoKey -- CONTENTS.DOC and READ.ME. If you run short of space on the disc while using LocoKey, we recommend you to use the CP/M ERASE command to erase these files from your disc. (How to use this command is described in your PC'W user guide.)

You can use LocoScript's Erase file option to erase the files but then you have to be careful to erase the Limbo copies of these files as well (see Session 7) - otherwise the space won't be recovered for use under CP/M. (CP/M treats Limbo files exactly like all the other files on the disc: it doesn't automatically erase these to make space.)
